Doodle Dogs

1. Print out the template and use it to draw out the basic outline onto a piece of card or thicker drawing paper. (You can get an adult to freehand draw it onto paper or even trace it off the screen if you don't have printer. If you only have thin paper then glue two pieces together so your dog can stand up later!)



2. Carefully cut out the shape (you might want some adult help!) You can now bend the head down and adjust its ears. Fold along the horizontal line and then your dog will stand up! You might need to adjust its feet if he's a bit wobbly.

3. Now time to get creative! Decorate the whole dog with as much pattern and detail as possible. Use a biro, black fine liner pen or felt pen and try and vary the pattern as you move around the body. Use my doodle inspiration if you are stuck for pattern or just make your own up. Zigzags, circles, dots, waves, crosses etc

4. Add colour if you wish with felt pens or colouring pencils or even watercolour paint if you have any. Highlighter pens and gel pens and even gems and stickers would be amazing too!

5. Extension: Create a whole family of dogs in varied patterns with different personalities. Name your dog!

6. Display your dog at home or post it to a relative who might love to receive a dog in the post!
