If your child would like to practise French at home, I am making available the self-assessment sheets they use in school at the end of each term. The outcomes on these sheets are a very good representation of more than 90% of the content we cover in class. Your child can therefore look over the history of their learning and practise areas of their choice in any way they wish. In lessons at school, there is a very strong focus on speaking, listening and reading. We are particularly hot on correct pronunciation and speaking in a natural, expressive way. Written tasks are done on an occasional basis and will not be a feature of the home learning packs for French.

I recommend pupils explore YouTube for instructional videos and songs. A good place to start is the channel Learn French with Alexa. Alexa has a lovely, friendly style and provides tuition at introductory level.
