

Curriculum Intent.

At Seaford Primary School we have high aspirations for our children and strive to provide them with an exciting, ambitious curriculum which will prepare them for the continual journey of lifelong learning and adventure which lie ahead. Opportunities are planned to encourage the children to develop curiosity and critical thinking and question, investigate and evaluate. Our School Values of respect, friendship, perseverance, empathy, ambition and enjoyment are embedded within our curriculum and aim to engender a sense of pride and high aspiration in our children.

Spiritual, moral, social and cultural learning are infused throughout the curriculum and the development of children's emotional and mental health and well-being is a core priority within our curriculum and wider provision.

We value the importance of physical health and well-being and this is promoted through a wide range of curricular and extra-curricular opportunities, including links with external clubs and sports providers. Our curriculum intends to provide a range of creative and artistic opportunities where children have the opportunity to develop skills and experience through art, drama and music. Our music provision enables all children to engage extensively with the subject, enabling all children to learn a musical instrument as well as participating in a wide range of opportunities for composing and performing music.

Throughout our curriculum we strive to use quality first-hand experiences and a range of educational visits and visitors to enhance learning and maximise engagement and enjoyment, whilst also linking current appropriate skills and experiences to future learning and career paths in later life. We plan to deliver a high-quality environment which supports and stimulates the children's learning and celebrates achievement.
