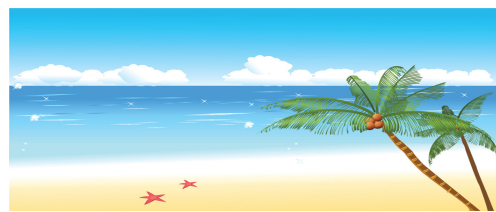
## School Year 2009 - 2010.
